- 1. Entry tags will be available for pickup at UnionLand Feed or after 8:30am on Monday, July 18 at the Floral Hall.
- 2. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry per class. Exhibitors are responsible for making entries in the correct divisions and classes. Classes with grade restrictions are for the grade just completed.
- 3. Plants & materials including wine & beer should be brought to the Floral Hall on the fairgrounds on Monday, July 18, between 8:30 am and noon. Please have your entry tags attached. Artistic, flower specimens and junior division entries are to be brought between 8:30 am and noon on Monday, July 18. All items must be checked in with the Superintendent.
- 4. The Fair Board and Superintendent will strive to assure the safety of all items after arrival and placement, but neither the Board nor Superintendent will be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.
- 5. Judging is Monday, July 18.
- 6. Best of Show Rosettes may be awarded for outstanding exhibits at the Judge's discretion.
- 7. Premium will be awarded. All decisions of the judge are final.
- 8. The Superintendent and Fair Board reserve the right to disqualify any entry. Exhibitors should review the general rules governing exhibitors and the Fair displayed elsewhere.
- Exhibits will be released at between 11am 2pm on Sunday, July 24 and must be removed by 2:00 pm. Exhibitors will not be permitted to enter booths to claim exhibits. Neither the Superintendent nor Fair Board is responsible for exhibits left after 2:00 PM.
- 10. The horticulture and artistic division is open to all exhibitors, ages 17 and over, but not professionals.
- 11. Accessories and figurines may be included in the arrangements. Wedging is also permitted.
- 12. Plant specimens must have only ONE plant in the container (unless stated differently) and must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 13. House plants are to be in possession of the exhibitor for three months prior to show.
- 14. Any exhibit that is infested with insects or disease will not be allowed.
- 15. When delivering your show items to the Floral Hall, please move your vehicle to the regular parking area immediately after unloading. We thank you for your cooperation.
